

DECEMBER NEWSLETTER



On October 29, 2018, city, state and Congressional leaders joined with neighborhood leaders to break ground with Children's Friend President and CEO, David Caprio, on a \$7M restoration of the former Althea Street School/Asa Messer Annex in Providence. The building will become an Early Childhood Center of Excellence for the city's West End for the 2019/20 academic year.

Located at 245 Althea Street, the school was closed in 2012 and has been sitting vacant ever since. With the jump start of a \$4.5M grant from Federal Head Start (secured with assistance from Rhode Island's Congressional delegation) the building will be transformed into a first class early learning and family support center.

Children (ages three to five) will be able to attend a full-day, academic-year educational program, in place of the




current 660-hour, part-time program that Children's Friend provides in morning and afternoon sessions.

In addition to Head Start, the Center of Excellence will provide low-income children and families with a wide range of programs and services to include child care, Early Head Start, and mental health services and will host community meetings and professional development training for staff and community members.

The new Center of Excellence will also provide the West Side Play Space (WSPS) with a designated play space for activities and access to common areas of the building.

As a result of this collaboration, young children and families in the West End will benefit from access to this newly renovated community hub and all of the amenities that it will offer.

Thanks to a wonderful new partnership between Children's Friend and McAuley Village, children living there and in the surrounding neighborhood now have easy access to the Children's Friend Head Start Program.
